## EARLY SIGNS OF POISONING

- Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Droping
- Depression
- Agitation
- Seizures
- Lethargy
- Loss of appetite
- Inability to urinate
- Nosebleeds
- Bleeding gums
- Black or bloody stools

### BE PREPARED!

Keep **Hydrogen Peroxide** and **Activated Charcoal** on hand in case of poisoning.
